## The Navigator's Compass By SK Emmet Jones, FN



**Editor's Note:** This issue of The Catholic Patriot talks about our gift of Christmas wreaths to the Vet's Home in Lebanon.

### The Christmas Wreath

This year, this month, this

week, our Forth Degree Assembly #906, gave Christmas Wreaths, again, to the Veteran's Home in Lebanon. Even with the Covid-19 plague we managed to mask and social distance while delivering both green holy and eatable wreaths thanks to efforts by 4th Degree Knights of Columbus and Leanna, the receptionist at the home.



So where did the tradition and custom or the wreath come from? The word wreath comes from the word "writhen" that was an old English word meaning "to writhe" or "to twist." The art of hanging Christmas wreaths originated from the Romans who hung wreaths on their doors as a sign of victory and of their status in society. What victory is it that we honor? The victory of Jesus Christ who came into our world and our lives to save us from our sin and who leads us to the city of God forever.

Christmas wreaths are made by twisting or bending evergreen branches into a large circle which are then decorated with pine cones and bow. The circle shape of the wreath is made to represent Christ's eternal love, his strength, and the creation of new life. Evergreens are commonly used in the construction of the wreath due to their heartiness throughout harsh winters and that they denote strength as well as immortality.

Christmas wreaths are also connected with the pagan holiday of Yule, marking the winter solstice, which was celebrated by ancient Germanic and Scandinavian peoples. This 12-day festival, which was also called midwinter, was held to honor the returning of the sun and the seasonal cycle. The wreaths used during Yule were meant to symbolize nature and the promise of spring. But perhaps the most widespread and well-known use of wreaths comes in connection with Christmas and with Christianity, as their circular shape is said to symbolize eternal life and the unending love of God. In the 16th century, the use of wreaths during Yule was adopted by Christians and became a custom in the form of Advent wreaths. These wreaths were traditionally made of evergreens, which also symbolize eternal life, holly oak, and red berries. The red berries and the thorny leaves of the holly oak represented the crown of thorns worn by Jesus and the drops of blood that they drew.

No matter what traditions your family celebrates, there may be room in them for an evergreen wreath on your door or an advent wreath with four candles on your table. By sharing our joy with others, who may not have as much family to share with, we can bring a bit of charity and joy to them. Through the symbols we see in the wreaths we can open our hearts and share our love to those who are in need of some. As Knights of Columbus this is exactly what we have promised to do and what we must do as Catholic men.
