CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

August is for some the last chance at summer before the Labor Day Weekend signals its official conclusion. It is also the month in which we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Mother and it is the month in which we commemorate one of our greatest saints, Augustine.

He lived from 354 until 430, but spent the first three decades of his life in unholy living. Despite his popularity, success and intelligence he was never at peace. Augustine could serve as the poster man for so many in our modern culture.

After searching and wrestling with himself for years, his turning point came one day when he was sitting in a garden. Caught up with his inner turmoil, he suddenly heard the voice of a child chanting, "Tolle lege, Tolle lege" (Take up and read! Take up and read!) Prompted by the Holy Spirit he picked up a Bible and read from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans. "Let us conduct ourselves properly as in the day, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in promiscuity and licentiousness, not in rivalry and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the desires of the flesh." (Romans 13:13-14)

That moment began his journey to become a Christian, a Bishop, and a Doctor of the Church, one of its greatest minds. His conversion is summarized in a famous quote that is one of my personal favorites. There is a plaque with this passage from the first page of his *Confessions* in the vestibule of St. Mary of the Pines. "O God, You have made us for Yourself, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You." That is a beautiful prayer to remember and one on which to base our own search for holiness.

Oh that I might know you! Oh that you would enter into my heart, and inebriate it, that I may forget my ills, and embrace you, with all my soul! In your pity, teach me. Behold, Lord, my heart is before you; open the ears thereof, and say unto my soul, I am your salvation. After this voice let me haste, and take hold on you. Hide not your face from me. 


