CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

I am sure everyone is familiar with the “**Divine Praises.**” They are recited at the end of Benediction and were composed around 1800 in reparation for profanity and blasphemy. Recently, a new feast was added to the Liturgical Calendar, this year observed on **Friday, January 3, The Most Holy Name of Jesus.** While we reverence the Holy Name of Jesus, and, indeed all that is Holy, it is obvious to each of us that we live in a culture where the sacred is readily cast aside and things holy are casually mocked. It reveals the pervasiveness of evil. We could easily speak of an epidemic of blasphemy.

In light of this awful trend, it is incumbent upon us as Knight of Columbus to live the spirit of the Divine Praises. Just as we dedicate ourselves to defending life, I invite us to renew our commitment to fight against all forms of disrespect to the Name of God, Jesus, Mary and all saints, indeed, all that is holy. The Knights have always been defenders of the Church and her clergy. May we also be known for our defense of all that is sacred.

Tragically, there are so many instances of profanity that at times it can feel like swatting flies, but we must be diligent. We can't solve everything, but we can do our small part.

Here is one story along these lines that I once heard many years ago and has remained with me. It seems there was this man who was shopping in a grocery store. As he went about his business, he kept bumping into another man who was also shopping. Each time they bumped into each other, the man telling the story heard the other man mindlessly misusing God's name. With each chance encounter, the other man kept using profanity. Finally, he couldn't take it any longer and our hero shared what he decided to do. He started deliberately following the man around the store and when he heard him say, God d...., he would say out loud, “**God be praised.**” After a few times, the blasphemous shopper caught on and confronted the man. The speaker shared his response: “**I told him that if he was going to damn Him, then I was going to praise Him!**” As it turned out, the man, thankfully, accepted the lesson and admitted he needed to change.

I don't know if I would have that same courage, but it is an inspiring example of one small way of combatting the tide. As we begin a new year, may we be committed to protecting all that is sacred, all that is holy, above all, the Name of God, the name of Jesus!

“Blessed be God; Blessed be His Holy Name; Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God and true man; Blessed be the Name of Jesus; Blessed be His Most Sacred Heart; Blessed be His Most Precious Blood; Blessed be Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar; Blessed be the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete; Blessed be the great Mother of God, Mary most holy; Blessed be her holy and Immaculate Conception; Blessed be her glorious Assumption; Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother; Blessed be Saint Joseph, her most chaste spouse; Blessed be God in his angels and in his saints.”

I wish to each a Blessed and healthy New Year!

It is my sad duty to announce the death on Jan. 22, 2019 of the Most Rev. John Mortimer Smith, Bishop Emeritus (2010-2019) and Ninth Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton (1997-2010), former Coadjutor Bishop of Trenton (1995-1997), former Bishop of the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee in Florida (1991-1995) and former Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Newark (1988-1991). Bishop Smith died in Morris Hall Meadows, Lawrenceville, after a long illness. He was 83 years old.

Born June 23, 1935, in Orange, to Mortimer and Ethel Smith, both now deceased, Bishop Smith was the oldest of three children with two brothers, the Rev. Andrew Smith, O.S.B., and Gregory Smith. Bishop Smith attended St. Benedict's Preparatory School in Newark, and John Carroll University in Cleveland, Ohio. He entered Immaculate Conception Seminary at Seton Hall University in South Orange in 1955 and was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Newark on May 27, 1961. A graduate of The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., Father Smith obtained a doctorate in Canon Law in 1966.

In the Archdiocese of Newark, Father Smith held several positions, among them Assistant Chancellor, Tribunal official, parish priest, Director of the Cursillo Movement and Dean of Bergen County. In 1971, Father Smith was named a Monsignor by now-Pope St. Paul VI.

In 1982, Monsignor Smith was appointed to the faculty of the Pontifical North American College in Rome where he served until his return to Newark in 1986. He was appointed Pastor of St. Mary Parish, Dumont, and, later, as the Archdiocese's Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia. On Dec. 1, 1987, he was named Auxiliary Bishop of Newark, and was consecrated Jan. 25, 1988.

Bishop Smith was appointed Bishop of the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee on June 25, 1991. He returned to New Jersey as Coadjutor Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton in 1995 where he succeeded the late Bishop John C. Reiss in 1997. He served as Bishop of Trenton for 13 years until his retirement at age 75 in 2010.

Bishop Smith is survived by his two brothers.

May he rest in peace.
