Local Middle School Students Compete in 2018 Knights of Columbus Spelling Bee

Eleven 6th thru 8th grade students, representing six area junior high and middle schools, competed in the 36th Annual Knights of Columbus Spelling Bee held Saturday, February 10, 2018, at the KC Hall in Arlington Heights.

The first place finisher was Katelyn Lee, of Thomas Middle School in Arlington Heights. The second place finisher was Christine Yuan of St. Mary School in Buffalo Grove. The third place finisher was Zach Greenwell of South Middle School in Arlington Heights.

The Bee used 154 words and lasted 23 rounds. Throughout the Bee, spellers traversed words such as *clambering*, *alacrity*, *vociferous*, *stevedores*, *generalissimo*, *monomania*, and *tapirs*. The Bee concluded when Katelyn Lee spelled both *voluminous* and *crematoria* correctly to claim first place.

All three finalists have qualified to compete in the Regional Spelling Bee on February 24 in Glenview, where the top three finishers of the Regional Bee will qualify for the state tournament in April.
