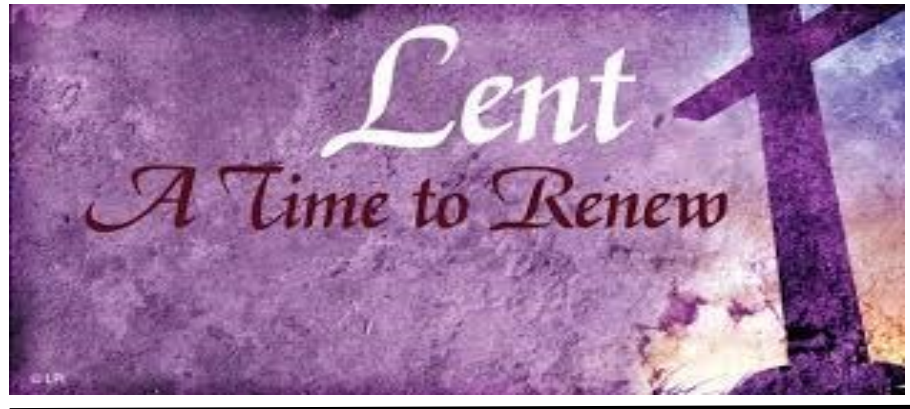

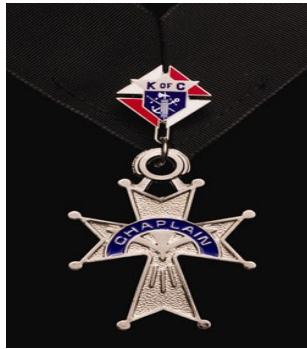
PRAYER FOR THE CANONIZATION OF

Chaplain's Message

February 17, 2021 is universally celebrated by the Christian Community as Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday in the Catholic Church begins the season of Lent. **Lent, has a practice of encouraging its members to Pray, Fast and give Alms.**

It is appropriate that the Scripture Readings of Lent are directed towards these three practices. On Ash Wednesday itself, we have the first reading from the book of the Prophet Joel:

“Even now, says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning. Rend your hearts, not your garments, and return to the Lord, your God.”

Let this be our motivating theme for the season, so that, the Easter Joy at Easter time will be the great Joy of our union with the Risen Lord.

Remember the words are “Rend your hearts not your garments”. In other words, what I understand is that it has to be a “inward” decision from our hearts and not merely from an outward show!! Let our Prayer, fasting and giving alms be from the sincerity of our hearts. The Catholic Church and the Knights of Columbus give us ample opportunities to enter into this spirit.

Let us take advantage of them. And, may I add, let us find our own ways to add on to our Spiritual Life. Let us be more fervent in our simple prayers like the rosary, morning and evening prayers etc. But if possible, let us see if we can frequent the week day masses and the Stations of the Cross. Together with our prayers we are also encouraged to ‘fast’. While fasting is usually associated with depriving ourselves from some foods, it is also encouraged with abstaining from certain behaviors. Let us seriously give this some thought.

As members of the Knights of Columbus we are not only called to be good “Christians” we are also called and encouraged to be good “Christian Leaders”. Therefore, as we practice our Christian life, let us also be instrumental in being good motivators of practicing the “Christian Values” in our daily practice.

With every good wish to you and your families, I wish you a happy and holy Lent Season.

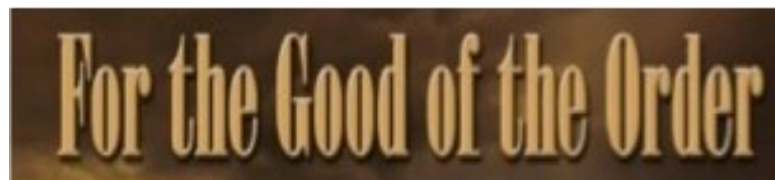

OUR CALL TO ACTION

Recently I watched the mini-series "The Pacific", a program aptly named as it centers around the Pacific theater in World War II. Often the war with Japan conjures images of multiple air and naval battles, but *The Pacific* focused primarily on Marine combat on multiple Pacific islands involved in the war.

Viewers have an opportunity to see the transformation of eager men leaving home for the first time, freshly out of boot camp, thrown into horrendous fighting and becoming seasoned fighting men after experiencing the first-hand brutality of close combat. The stark atrocities of war serve to alter their prospective in ways they could not have imagined, nor could anyone not present truly understand. Ultimately by experiencing combat, the Marines are changed for the rest of their lives.

When we stop to consider the story of Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney, we know he also stepped up and served. Fr. McGivney was faced with progressively more challenging trials as priest and later pastor of his parish: administering to the sick, providing for the orphaned, evangelizing the Catholic Faith during a time of persecution, and other activities to sustain both Catholics and non-Catholics. He eventually succumbed to an illness attributed to his ministrations to the sick. We can only surmise these experiences changed Fr. McGivney throughout his life.

Like the war in the Pacific, we did not experience firsthand what Fr. McGivney endured, so it is hard to utterly understand the full weight of

his service, but we can draw parallels to his ministrations, to those of men fighting in *The Pacific*. Both acted and stood up for causes in which they believed. Both worked actively, facing progressively more difficult situations while working toward their goals. And both made an indelible difference improving the lives of others often making sacrifices in their own.

We as Knights of Columbus should take note of the actions of these men, both priest and servicemen, who serve as role models for us. When we step up to follow the Mission established by Fr. McGivney, we too are serving our families and Catholic communities and fellow man.

Just as the tasks of the servicemen in *The Pacific* became increasingly difficult, and the tasks of Fr. McGivney became more challenging, we will find ourselves facing new challenges, like COVID-19 pandemic or a political climate becoming more hostile to Catholics. But as they did, we as Knights need to answer the call to make them a better place for both our families and new Catholics.

It will not be easy but when we as Knights work with other Knights, we can successfully face these challenges and make a difference. And we will be changed by these experiences and be better Catholics and Knights. Some Knights have figured this out and are doing amazing things: hosting events and finding new Brother Knights! Let us follow these role models and find strength to put our Faith into Action, just as they did, as our servicemen did, and Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney did. It will change your life.

Our Lady of Humility (OLH) Council 13598 continue constructing a grotto dedicated to Our Lady of Fatima

In 2009 The Knights of Columbus Council 13598 asked, then Pastor Fr. David Mulvihill for permission to develop a section of the newly acquired property, to the West, to develop as a meditation site for the parish starting with the Stations of the Cross, with continued development into a circular pathway with imbedded Rosary, and finally a Grotto setting for Our Lady of Fatima with the three children.

Fortunately, our council had a Knight who was owner of a construction business, who had the necessary equipment and know-how to get this done. With a team of dedicated fellow Knights, we began the project.



We started the final phase of the Meditation site, the grotto, just about at the beginning of the

pandemic and worked piecemeal throughout the spring, summer and fall. With the arrival of the statues which we ordered from a company in China, things began to fall in place quickly. All told it took approximately 2,250 manhours to get the project about 95% complete. We are in a holding pattern now due to winter weather. There are a few cosmetic tasks and lighting which should be completed early spring.

As mentioned, we are expecting to complete the project early this spring. We are planning a parish picnic and will be inviting our new bishop to dedicate the grotto sometime this summer. Of course, this depends on our current pandemic restrictions being lifted.

2020-2021 Covid 19 Free Throw protocols for Illinois State Tournament

All participants must sign up to participate in this year's Free throw Championship competition; this includes any knight, parent, or guardian. Name, and phone number will be needed to enter the competition site. This is being done in the event that any participant, parent/guardian, or knight shows COVID-19 symptoms within two weeks post competition, so all others can be notified, tested, and quarantined for 14 days.

To keep the amount of people in the building to a minimum only one age group will be in the building at a time. Each age group will be divided at 30-35 at minute intervals (9-year-old...12-12:30, 10-year-old 12:30-1 PM, 11-year-old 1-1:30 PM, 12-year-old 1:30-2 PM, 13-year-old 2-2:30 PM and 14-year-old 2:30 -3 PM.) Show up time for each age group will be 10 minutes prior to competition time. All competitors and their spectator will remain in their vehicle until their check in time. If a family has more than one competitor, [the other competitor(s)] may remain in the building with their parent/guardian during their sibling's competition; per Safe Environment Guidelines.

Everyone entering the building will have their temperature taken and their hands sprayed with hand sanitizer with only those who are considered healthy being allowed to participate. Anyone that has COVID-19 symptoms or is running temperature will not be allowed into the building. Anyone who accompanied the person exhibiting symptoms will not be allowed into the building for precaution reasons.

All participants must wear masks prior to and after their participation. While shooting they may remove their mask.

Each participant may only have one guest to remain with them during the competition; exception being families with more than one competitor in different age group; per Safe Environment Guidelines.

An additional round of competition (Diocese) will be added to lessen the quantity of players (and their guest) at any one competition. (Keeping the amount at any one competition under 100 people).

Any Knight(s) who will be rebounding will sanitize their hands between competitors. Balls will be sanitized between competitors with two or three balls being used for the entire competition.

Boys (ages 9-11) and girls (ages 9-14) will use a women's regulation sized basketball 28.5 inches. Boys ages 12-14 will use a regulation men's basketball 29.5 inches.

To ensure COVID-19 safety all records will be emailed to the knight in charge of the next level of competition. Council chairman will mail to the district chairman, District to Regional chairman, Regional to Diocese chairman. All levels will send all records to the State chairman for reduction.

Spectators will be asked to adhere to Co-vid guidelines-wearing a mask and social distancing of 6 feet please.

Additionally, a number of options can be utilized to bring as many participants to compete as possible. Councils should offer schools the option to hold their council competitions during school gym classes and ask for permission to have one Safe Environment compliant knight help facilitate the shooting with the gym teacher. If school shooting is not allowed and the school in, you will not allow the use of their gym. Participants may shoot outside without council participation as long as it is recorded and sent to their district deputy with a completed score sheet. **All score sheets if sent by computer must be sent in pdf form for ease of printing.** Mailed version of score sheets may be sent to the District deputy or next level of competition chairman. Each level [may or may not] have a competition depending on availability of a venue (for district, regional, diocesan or semi-final) and may be video-taped and submitted with completed score sheets. GENERAL ENTRY FORM with COMPETITION PARAMETERS

1. This is a team competition. Teams must be sponsored by an Illinois Knights of Columbus Council.
2. Teams consist of 4 participants. A minimum of 2 of the team participants **must be members** of the Knights of Columbus in Good Standing. The two remaining participants are guests (male or female) of the sponsoring council. Bowlers must declare an average, per K of C International Bowling rules.
3. Teams will bowl 3 games in the competition (12 total lines of bowling). Cost is \$30 per participant, total of \$120 per team. Singles included in team fee. Doubles teams are \$50/team. One (1) Doubles bowler must be a K of C member.
4. Participants must be 18 years of age as of 1 July 2020.
