

Disease is nothing new and we as humans have coped in one way or another for centuries, granted sometimes much better than others, but then again despite what

the government and their experts tell us, there is no comprehensive handbook on epidemic management.

We need to cautiously listen to the provided guidelines and decide what is reasonable and what is contrived. Only God knows what will happen and how our current situation fits within His plan. We must trust in him. But that does not mean we should be reckless or conversely paralyzed with fear. I'm not one for conspiracy theories, but if I were an anti-family, anti-religious political organization, I might take advantage of the present situation and plant the seeds of despair as well as disrupt social interaction at all levels.

Social distancing effectively keeps the more established generations from meeting and conversing for fear of health issues and prevents the newer younger generations from learning problem-solving social skills that are essential in decision making, making them more susceptible to the suggestions of media and government in the future. Look what we are already seeing with Antifa and their inability to resolve conflict through compromise.

We as Knights are limited in what we can do but that does not mean we can do nothing. On the contrary, more than ever we need to find ways to stay in communication with our Brothers and Councils. We need to seek out means of supporting our Pastor and encourage "spiritual maintenance"; ways we can keep our Catholic faith unwavering and keep all people in our parish community engaged. Ask yourself, how involved am I with my Council? Could we as a group do better to assist our Pastor and each other? Am I sharing activities and opportunities that I hear about,

see on social media, or provided by Supreme Council? Am I stepping up to be the glue of spirituality for my family and fellow Catholics? It is not too late to start.


You can discuss with Council Brothers, ways to not only stay in communication: conference calls, web meetings, socially distanced committee meetings, etc., but also how we can join St. Michael the Archangel and defend our fellow Catholics and our Faith. Yes, we serve our Queen Mary, but also we must take our lead from St. Michael and join the fight against the daily attacks of Satan.

Please reconnect with your Brothers! Ask like-minded Catholic men to join our Order and help where others may not be able get out. We are NOT just collecting members as tally marks on a ledger, but recruiting because we need men who want to serve their Church and are willing to take action NOW!. Chances are if you see them out carrying on their lives, they will be willing to join the cause. They are our future and must be encouraged to defend their faith.

All of us need to be the spark, the catalyst and make things happen, putting our Faith into Action. Otherwise Satan has won.

Food for Families



“You pray for the hungry. Then you feed them. That’s how Prayer works.” – Pope Francis

The need for food to feed hungry families is ongoing especially during November and December. Keep up the good work by helping others have enough to eat during these tough times.

The Knights of Columbus is committed to ending hunger in our local communities by asking local councils to participate in the Order wide Food for Families Program...

To encourage local Knights of Columbus councils to participate in this worthwhile program, the Supreme Council offers financial rebates to councils, assemblies or Squires circles that donate food or money.

For councils or assemblies, the Supreme Council will refund \$100 for every \$500 donated, or for every 1,000 pounds of food that a council contributes to a parish food pantry, community food bank or soup kitchen - up to a maximum of \$500 per council/assembly per fraternal year.

Reported contributions of food and/or monetary donations should be cumulative for the fraternal year and there is no need to send in a refund request every time a contribution is made. However, to be eligible for the rebate, the cumulative total of contributions of food/money needs to be at a minimum of \$500 or 1,000 pounds of food for councils or assemblies.

Participating councils, and assemblies, should report activity and apply using the Food for Families Refund and Plaque Application (#10057).
