Anyone who wishes to know God and to love God need to pray, read scriptures, follow sacred tradition, read the catechism, and do all they can to learn about our heavenly Father.



#### ON THE COVER: ST. AUGUSTINE OF HIPPO

One of the most well-known Fathers of the Church, Augustine of Hippo was born Tagaste, Algeria in 354 AD. He led a hedonistic lifestyle in his early life, seekly worldly and sexual pleasures. He even had a son, Adeodatus, with a woman he loved and lived with for several years. Eventually, the influence his mother, Monica, had on his life led him to commit himself to the church. He was baptised by St. Ambrose when he was 33 and he vowed to live a life of celibacy. Over the course of his life, he wrote over 200 books and over a thousand letters, sermons, and other works. He died on August 28, 430 AD. His and mother's feast days are both celebrated this month.

WE ARE OFF TO A VERY SLOW START in this new Fraternal Year. As of July 25, we have assigned a total of 23 new E-members since July 1.nThis is less than half of the pace that we need to meet our State Goals. So far Councils have transferred 9 Emembers into Councils this Fraternal Year. Roughly 36% of Council Intake this year has been through E-members. This is a significant drop-off from the prior Fraternal Year. We are better than this.

Cards with the QR Code to join online are available from Supreme. These can be very helpful when inviting men to join. Your Diocesan Membership Directors and District Deputies should be able to help you get these cards if you need them.

#### **REMINDERS**

WGK & WFS please frequently review your councils **Prospect** tab. Should you experience any difficulty with this process, please email me regarding these outstanding assigned e-members and I will gladly assist you.

Supreme presented a Webinar in December on Transferring online members to council membership which you can access <u>here.</u>

Do not send Form 100's to Supreme for new members, keep them for your council's records. If you must use a Form 100, scan it and email it to Supreme, keeping the original for your council records. Since Form 100's must be manually processed at Supreme, they can lead to data entry errors and delays. Utilizing emembership or the Candidate tab for new members are the preferred ways to bring in new members. The date field is the date they were exemplified by your council. Once you enter those dates in either tab, the members will be automatically transferred to your council's roster within the next week.

#### PROSPECT TAB

The **Prospect** tab shows you emembers that have joined online via the Supreme app. The date your council when they have completed their exemplification. With e-membership, new members enter their own data and confirm their membership, and then they receive an e-mail from Supreme. These e-members are then part of the state council, and get assigned to a local council. Until the local FS enters members remain part of the State Council. Local councils get credit for them when the exemplification date is entered by the FS to transfer them into your Council.

Clicking on this blue box will take you to the Prospect training.

#### CANDIDATE TAB

The **Candidate** tab is what you use when you recruit a member locally or are handling a member transfer request or a reinstatement of a prior member. The Candidate tab can best be described as an online Form 100. The candidate tab training covers new members and transfers into local councils.

Clicking on this red box will take you to the candidate training.

#### **Program Focus: Boost Participation & Compliance**

Our Disaster Relief Program also needs attention; consider how we can extend help, as seen with the Janesville Knights or aid for California, Hawaii, and Texas disasters. Disasters strike anytime; our presence is crucial. Involve parish families in your programs! Their participation shows the good we do and can encourage new members. Youth can work alongside Knights, promoting youth programs for their well-being and our future councils.

#### **Immediate Action Required:**

Youth Safety Program: Grand Knights, Deputy Grand Knights, Program Directors, and Community Directors must complete this Supreme-mandated training to work with youth.

Fraternal Benefits Insurance Program: Host two events. The first, by January 1, 2026, involves the Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight meeting with an insurance agent for a benefits presentation. The second needs at least 14 attendees (including parishioners) to learn about KofC benefits and membership value.

IT IS NOW AUGUST, WHICH MEANS IT'S TIME TO GET those fall program plans set up and ready to operate full tilt in September. The first of those is our #1 community program—Coats for Kids. Some 300,000 coats were given away last year nationally, and we hope to do better in 2025! Once again, the State Council, in cooperation with Supreme, can offer coats at a price nearly 50% off for both boys and girls (\$145/case for toddler, child and youth sizes or \$175/ case for teen and adult sizes). You'll need to get your orders in before September 15, the earlier the better! See State Coats Coordinator PSD Corey Coonan's email of July 26 to GKs and FSs for details on ordering or check the State website (State Council Store link). However you choose to secure your coats or other items to distribute, let's do a great job on this for 2025!

We continue to urge councils to (1) make plans to get involved in local Habitat projects and fundraisers for the fall and winter months, and (2) work together with neighboring councils or your district to hold fundraisers to purchase wheelchairs during the fall months. You can check out the Supreme website for more information on these two programs. Also, check with your pastor, school, and pastoral council for ideas on at least one Helping Hands project you can carry out, coordinate, or assist with this fall.

State Disaster Relief Coordinators Paul Shepherd and Don McInnes have several plans and goals they'll be talking about with you at the Diocesan Meetings in September. Right now, you'll want to be planning blood drives and disaster relief donations in your '25-'26 budget and determining a Disaster Relief Coordinator for your Council.

This year we have two new community programs from Supreme: "Bright Futures" and "Celebrating our Catholic Heritage." More information on these can be found here. Print resources are available at Supplies Online.

For Youth programs, Punt, Pass, Kick is business as usual. Council window is July-September 30. Diocesan contests will be held October 3-19. The State Finals are TBD (likely in Wausau October 25, November 1 or 8). Travel cards will be available to Councils and DDs at the Diocesan Meetings in September.

Fall Soccer window is the same as PPK. If your Council runs Soccer this fall or did so last spring, make sure it is reported to me via Form 10784 or the form in the State Instruction packet ASAP. Diocesan and state contests will be held in the same windows as PPK if we get enough contestants to warrant holding them!

The Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest for 2025 topic is "Of the 287 popes who have led the Catholic Church, who are your 3 favorite ones and why?" Order your contest kit from Supreme Supplies Online. Get the information to schools, religious ed programs, homeschoolers, etc., in August and early September. Students are to write their essays in October and November. They are due to Councils by December 15. They are to be judged and 1st, 2nd place winners sent on to your DPC by December 31.

The Knowledge and Free Throw Contests will again be run as before, as will the Culture of Life Essay Contest and the Hockey Skills Challenge. I'll address those in more details next month. The Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest, though technically part of the "Family" program umbrella, will likely be run pretty much as it was last year. Our new Family and Poster Directors will have more on that in September.

The State Information packets for the youth contests are being updated in August and will be on the State website ASAP. I hope you have a great August.
