

Councils need to always be looking to grow future leaders by ensuring that all their members are asked to participate in the planning and execution of Council programs and events. Relying on the same few members puts your Council at risk of failure if someone moves away, passes away or has health issues. As you prepare for this years Council elections, ask your Nominating Committee to focus on inviting new men to your Council Leadership Team.

Thank you to those that took time over the past month to attend huddle/town hall discussions. Your feedback is useful as we continue to evolve the Knights of Columbus to meet the growing needs of our Families, Parishes, and Communities. I encourage all

Council Leaders to participate in these sessions when they are offered in your area.

Fraternal Benefit Events

One thing that became very clear during several of our discussions with Council leaders over the past few months is that Fraternal Benefit Events are largely misunderstood. Fraternal Benefit Events are not a hard sell on Financial Products and Insurance. Presented topics are useful information regardless of where you invest or purchase your insurance. On the Fraternal Benefit Events provided by General Agent Tim Nowak, presenters have included Bishops, Attorneys, and Financial Planners. Supreme recently added an On-Demand FBE – Work with your Field Agent to make arrangements for your Fraternal Benefit Events.

Councils Awards

People want to belong to organizations that make a difference. Council Awards are designed to recognize Councils that are making a difference. The Star Council Award recognizes the best Councils in the order each year. Latest Awards Tracker shows that as of March 23, 2024:

- ➤ 3 Councils have completed all requirements for Star Council,
- ➤ 21 Councils have completed the requirements for the McGivney Award,
- ► 17 Councils the Founders Award, and
- ▶ 8 Councils have completed the requirements for the Columbian Award.

The **Founders Award** recognizes Councils that have attended Fraternal Benefit Events. Following a Fraternal Benefit Event, the GK must submit form 11077 with the list of who attended and their contact information. In checking records from the State Council Virtual Fraternal Benefit Events, we have noticed a significant number of

Councils have participated in our Virtual Events but not yet submitted the paperwork.



Every Council should be able to host a couple of events and meet the requirements for the Founders Award.

The **Columbian Award** recognizes Councils for their Programs. To earn this award, councils must have 4 programs in each of the Faith in Action areas (Faith, Family, Community and Life), and then submit form SP-7 to document these programs. Councils are encouraged to submit Form SP-7 as early as possible so that any issues can be resolved prior to the June 30 deadline. There is no reason that every active Council should not meet the requirements for the Columbian Award.

The **McGivney Award** recognizes Councils for Membership Growth. Councils that meet or exceed their membership goal are awarded the McGivney Award.

To earn the **Star Council Award**, Councils must be current in Per Capita payments to Supreme, Safe Environment Compliant, submit forms 365 and 1728, and meeting the requirements for the Founders, McGivney, and Columbian Awards.

Finish Strong

We have less than 3 months left in our Fraternal Year. The time is now to make a difference in our Parishes and Communities. The time is now to finish the last few requirements to get Councils recognized for all the hard work they have done this Fraternal Year. He also does this to live in each of His disciples. The apostles were energized to live the mission and the values of Jesus. Jesus sent them the Holy Spirit so that they could live in the same relationship between the Father and Son.

We are tracking 10% behind where we were last year while at the same time seeing an over 10% increase in our Goal to achieve Circle of Honor. As such, we are in need of roughly 400 men this last quarter to achieve the Circle of Honor success for a third consecutive year.

With over 300 councils in our State, each Council would only need to bring in at least one new member this quarter or if each council that is three new members away from reaching their Star Council goal were to do one or maybe two more exemplifications to try and achieve their goal, then we should reach our goal!

In recent memory, Wisconsin has never achieved three consecutive years of receiving the Circle of Honor recognition—an achievement that is bestowed upon all in the state for their hard work in growing programs and membership! We all play a vital role in our State's success, so if each of our councils do their part in bringing in at least one new member, we all will be successful!

To help spur focus for all councils to achieve success, we will be offering

some unique incentives once again this quarter. An e-mail will be sent out in the coming days, if not already received, to those councils that are eligible to receive an incentive. I hope all of you take advantage of another great opportunity for your council to grow your charitable efforts while also growing your membership!

Of note: Tom Brady is the NFL quarterback leader with an astounding 46 4th quarter comebacks. None is more memorable than the comeback from down 28-3 in the 4th quarter to the Atlanta Falcons on the biggest stage of them all, the Super Bowl. People in Atlanta may have already been popping champagne, making plans for the Super Bowl Parade, only for it to all come crashing down in a matter of less than hour. State Families and Membership, my brothers and sisters in Christ, greetings and blessings from the Nowak Agency.

Hello, to all of you! I am writing this newsletter during lent but before Easter, Palm Sunday to be exact. Some would say "Oh you're working on Sunday? Shame on you." However, writing to you is anything but work, as a matter of fact it is Evangelization and what a better day to do that then on Sunday.


Why do I call my newsletter or article Evangelization? Well as you know by now it is because I will tell you a story as a way to get you to think about what we do with the Knights a little differently. Two things I did this Lent was one, 33 days to Eucharistic GLORY, a dynamic catholic book that was a journey toward consecration to the Eucharist. As I walk this journey through this book, I realized many times how I take this wonderful sacrament for granted. It saddens me to say it but most of my adult life and part of my youth, I accepted the Eucharist into my body with near to none of the proper preparations. Thankfully my walk with the Knights and the challenges the Knights have put in front of me, showed me that many people who knew how to prepare and what it was to put myself in the proper state of grace. Knowing what I do now about the consecration today, I know what I am signing up for and why I believe it is important to share it with all of you.

I would be lying if I told you that no one I speak with is concerned

about the crisis of Faith that we are seeing in the great country today. A Crisis in vocations, and Marriage as a vocation, and Holy Orders. Each of us has an incredible story to tell others as to why our Faith and the sacraments mean so much to us. As I was listening to a Monsignor talk a few months back on the radio with Drew Mariany, he was talking about Drew being mad at God for his Father dying. Monsignor said, "You know why you're mad?" Drew said, "Yes I lost my father." Monsignor said, "No it is because you are an atheist. You want your will instead of God's will."

I believe you can tie in this crisis to all these wonderful sports kids and the situations they are in these days. They're traveling every week and becoming mini "demigods" themselves and when they lose, they blame it on God. God wants to build habits into your lives so when suffering happens you can give it to him to be added to his suffering and it can be used for good. Most people don't want to suffer at all anymore and the culture says get rid of suffering any way you can. As I was traveling this week to speak with a bunch of college students getting ready to graduate. I went through a town in Michigan where I notice a drive through two lanes wrapped around the building on a Friday night. I thought to myself, that must be a good fish fry. However, when coming back through on Saturday at 2:00pm in the afternoon the same place was even busier, so I decided to find out what was so good about this place. Well, it was a dispensary for Marijuana. People were waiting

and getting in line for a drive through of an "I don't



suffer" solution. It struck me that I should open a counselling center next door. The sad reality is that some people have so much pain that they'd rather continue masking the pain with drugs which will only make them, as a person, less whole.

Here's my second story for you. I decided to pick up a new habit during lent. Most of you already know but I go to daily mass, confession monthly, I say the rosary daily as well as St. Bridget prayers and the way of the cross. So, this Lent, I pick up daily adoration. I just take 15 minutes each day during lent, but I was not expecting to find that I needed so much time away from the world's problems. Most problems become an emergency when we don't deal with them right away. Have you ever prayed for God to explain the problem to you more and for him to show you the best way to handle that problem? Yeah, me neither. But I started doing the short way of the cross at adoration, and every time, when I come out of Adoration the problems are smaller and my God is Bigger. I would encourage all of you to take two things to adoration, vocations, and suffering.

AS KNIGHTS OUR goal is to help men, their families and their parishes grow closer to Christ. Through our programs and resources, we provide opportunities to live and spread the Catholic faith. The Supreme Council provide several resources on its website.

I want to bring your attention to the Eucharistic Revival section. As you are probably aware the goal of the Eucharistic Revival is "Renewing the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist."

I ask each council during its next meeting to watch the video "The Eucharist: Source of Our Healing" (https://www.kofc.org/en/who-we-are/our-faith/eucharist.html). Then begin planning how your council will support this important endeavor in the coming year.



THE COLUMBIAN AWARD recognizes excellence in your council's programming and charitable outreach. To earn this award your council must conduct and report programs in each of the four program categories (Faith, Family, Community, and Life) for a total of 16 program credits, with four in each category. A completed Columbian Award Application (#SP-7) must be received by the Supreme Council office by June 30 in order to earn this award. There are no required programs.

The Supreme Council has designated certain programs as featured programs in each of the program categories. When your council conducts a featured program and satisfies the associated requirements it will receive two credits towards that program category on their Columbian Award Application (#SP-7). The featured programs for each category are listed below.

- ► Faith Refund Support Vocation Program (RSVP), Holy Hour, Spiritual Reflection, Into the Breach
- ► Family Food for Families, Family of the Month, Family Prayer Night, Family Fully Alive
- ► **Community** Coats for Kids, Habitat for Humanity, Global Wheelchair Mission
- ► Life March for Life, Special Olympics, Ultrasound, Pregnancy Center Support (includes Aid and Support After Pregnancy ASAP)

The Blessed Michael J. McGivney Guild serves as a source for information about the life, works and spirituality of Father McGivney. The Guild distributes informational materials about him. receives reports of favors granted through his intercession and oversees the distribution of relics. Guild members receive regular updates on the progress of Blessed Michael J. McGivney's cause for canonization and are invited to participate in promoting devotion to this Servant of God. As of July 1, 2024 Wisconsin has only 1,264 out of 179,000 plus members registered in the Guild. Members of the Knights of Columbus are not automatically Guild members and must elect to join the Guild. The Blessed Michael J. McGivney Guild Newsletter is published bimonthly except July -August and is sent free to Guild members.



The following is a follow up on filing of taxes. We are all required to complete this!

RE: 2023 Tax Information for KofC Councils, Assemblies, & Chapters

This notice is to remind councils, assemblies, and chapters in the United States of their legal obligation to file an **IRS Form 990** (informational tax return) for the 2023 tax year,

The Knights of Columbus, including all subordinate councils, assemblies, and chapters

(collectively referred to as councils), is a tax-exempt organization, recognized by the Internal

Revenue Service as a fraternal benefit society under Section 501(c)(8) of the Internal Revenue

Code. This tax-exempt status requires each council to file an annual Form 990 with the IRS.

Councils reporting gross receipts of \$50,000 or less with less than \$200,000 in assets may comply with their obligation by filing the Form 990-N electronic postcard (also known as the ePostcard). Councils reporting gross receipts of more than \$50,000 and less than \$200,000 withtotal assets of less than \$500,000 must file the Form 990-EZ. Councils with gross receipts of \$200,000 or more and total assets of \$500,000 or more must file the Form 990.

REMINDER

The IRS requires electronic filing for all tax-exempt organizations, regardless of which form they

use. The online filing system, also known as "E-Services", requires all new users to register or sign in with LOGIN.GOV or ID.me, the current IRS credential service providers.

There are two ways to access the Form 990-N Electronic Filing system: (1) Sign in with your active IRS username; or (2) Sign in/create an account with LOGIN. GOV or ID.me. Form 990-N filers who have an existing IRS username and register for a new Login.gov or ID.me account must use the email address associated with their IRS account. Refer to User Guide for the IRS Form 990-N Electronic Filing System. Instructions are available on the IRS website, links to which are in the Where to File section, below.

DEADLINE TO FILE ANNUAL RETURN (ALL FORMS)

Each council must file its own tax return; there is no group or consolidated Form 990 filing. The returns must be filed by the fifteenth day of the fifth month following the end of the council's annual accounting period. For example, if a council's accounting period ends December 31, it must file a tax return by May 15 of the following year; if a council's accounting period ends June 30, it must file a tax return by November 15. Please note that the IRS assigns the accounting period to each council based on its Employer Identification Number (EIN). The IRS will not notify the council of the accounting period. To determine the accounting period assigned to your council's EIN, sign into the IRS system with your user ID and password. For most councils, the assigned accounting period corresponds to the calendar year. Vivat Jesus!

WGK & WFS please frequently review your councils **PROSPECT** tab and if you are having difficulty in making contact, or any other issue, please email me regarding these outstanding assigned e-members

and I will gladly assist you with reaching a remedy.

Remember:

The **PROSPECT** tab shows you e-members that have joined your council online via the Supreme app. and the date field is used when they have completed their exemplification.

The **CANDIDATE** tab is what you use when you recruit a member locally or are handling a member transfer request or a reinstatement of a prior member.

Again, the date field is the date they were exemplified by your council. Once you enter those dates in either tab, the members will be automatically transferred to your council's roster within the next week.

- ► Do not send Form 100's to Supreme for new members, keep them for your councils records.
- ► If you have any questions or concerns, contact me, I am in your State Directory.



BY THE TIME you're reading this, Lent will have passed, and we will be in the Easter Season. What does the Easter season mean to us as Knights of Columbus and Catholics? This is the season where our Youth will be receiving their First Holy Communion, and our Young Adults will be receiving the Holy Spirit in Confirmation. But it is so much more! It is when most Marriages joining a man and woman to each other for the rest of their lives. It is also a time when men are ordained as deacons or priests in our Dioceses. This is also the season where I review all the form #10784's that I expect to be flooded with as hopefully most of the over 300 councils partake in the Sacramental Gifts program.

Sacramental gifts do not have to cost hundreds of dollars. For First Communicants, consider a scapular, or a Rosary along with a book on how to pray it correctly. Or perhaps a book on the saints to help them contemplate who they wish to pick when they are Confirmed. For the those receiving the Holy Spirit remember we have the YouCat Bibles still available for \$12.50 each or you can present them with a copy of the "Catechism of the Catholic Church." For the newly ordained Priests who are dedicating their lives to Christ consider a Stole, Chasuble, or Chalice. Don't forget a remembrance gift to our newly baptized, especially their fathers. A gift from the Knights can help them be good Christian man and a great example for the next generation of Christians. There is nothing wrong if you also provide a pamphlet from the Knights with the gift encouraging who we are and how we support strong faith and fatherhood, and how joining us would enhance that!

As many of you know we will have the St. Joseph icon for another year since Supreme will not have new icon ready at the Supreme

Convention. Watching the reports on the icon has me puzzled especially the last few months when I started receiving copies of #10784 for Faith programs. From the last full rotation 2022-23 only 30 of the over 300 councils reported they had a service with the Icon. For the first 6 months of this year only 24 of the 140 councils that should have had it filled out form #10784. I have heard from District Deputies that the next District scheduled to receive the icon is refusing to take it because they already had it in the past. I can accept this, but when I also get phone calls from Councils who should have had it 2 months ago asking when they can get it, I sense something is drastically wrong. I'll be looking into making changes to this program for the third rotation.

This Summer, the Eucharistic Procession to the first Eucharistic Congress in 87 years pass through Wisconsin. I'm currently gathering information about the route but encourage all Councils and Assemblies consider how they can help their clergy support this amazing Faith opportunity. It is not every day that we get to walk alongside our Lord, as the Disciples did 2,000 years ago. Supreme will be expanding the Eucharistic program and Councils are encouraged to have local processions especially on key feast days. They have released an informational video to help you plan ahead.

The Silver Rose path for this summer is currently going through some fine tuning now. I will say that it looks like all the all of this year's services will be held in Parishes that did not have it last year. I should be publishing the final route on flock notes prior to the State Convention. I want to thank all the Councils that applied. If your council was not chosen this year, you will be given priority next year. Remember we have over 300 councils and we only have the Silver Rose in only 28 days.



A closing reminder we still have over 700 YouCat Bibles available this year. They were \$12.50 each, half the normal retail price because we purchased them in quantity. They can be ordered by credit or debit cards by pressing the blue icon **STATE COUNCIL STORE** on the first page of the State Website. Or if your council is paying by check,
