Put Out into the Deep...

Brothers,

We are now one month into the Fraternal Year, and District Meetings have been held in most districts. Thank you to those leaders that took the time to attend their District Meetings. Hopefully by now Council Officers have met and put together a plan for the Fraternal Year. The meetings that I was able to attend had lots of good interactions between those present, with Council Leaders leaving these meetings confident in meeting the requirements for Star Council Recognition.

In the last 20 years, membership in Knights of Columbus in the State of Wisconsin has shrunk by 30%, with another 10% be moved to Affiliate Member status last year. A major focus this year will be on reversing the trend of shrinking membership in Wisconsin and growing the order. I am asking that every Council host at least one Church Drive or Membership event each quarter, Every District hold at least one Exemplification every month, and that Every Council put together a plan to hit their membership goal, as well as ensure that they are net/net positive (replacing members lost to death, transfers, or affiliate program) in membership this fraternal year.

I know that this is a big ask, but we need every Council active in membership if we are going to grow again. Councils and Districts that plan for success consistently are recognized as Star Councils and Star Districts. I am asking that all Councils put together a Plan for Success, and then follow their plan. Working together we can grow membership in Wisconsin, but we need all Councils to participate.

As you know, a major focus of the Knights of Columbus over the next few years will be supporting the Eucharistic Revival, Holy Hours, and Eucharistic Processions. All our programs are an opportunity to put our Faith in Action. Having a State Chaplain that can help guide and lead the State Council is essential to our success. I am pleased to announce that Fr. Brian Dulli has accepted the appointment as State Chaplain. I look forward to working with Fr. Brian as State Chaplain as I am certain that he will be a strong leader for us.

State Secretary Miles Casey and State Family Director/State Forms and Awards Director Joe Uchytil are doing an outstanding job putting the State Directory together. Joe Uchytil has worked night and day on the directory project and has been instrumental in updating this process to work better in the future. Thank you, Joe and Miles. I also need to thank all the Council and District Leaders that have taken the time to review the drafts and respond with updates to the directory. Also thank you to IPSD Corey Coonen sending out hundreds of emails to verify email addresses, as well as getting drafts out to the Councils to review.

One other challenge that we need to address this year is growing our Leadership team. Too many councils have the same 5-6 guys doing everything. We need to invite more men to help lead. This starts with establishing a good description and expectations for what we are inviting them to do. As I look at the Forms 185 and 365 that Councils have submitted, there are many opportunities for men to step up and lead within their Councils. We also have many opportunities at the District, Diocesan, and State Levels for men to step up and lead. We need to invite men to join us. Our future depends on building a bench of leaders. If not now, then when? If not me, then who?

I look forward to working with all of you to grow the Knights of Columbus in the State of Wisconsin.

At this year's Supreme Convention in Nashville, the Wisconsin Jurisdiction was recognized as receiving the Circle of Honor recognition for the prior Fraternal Year (2021-2022).

Thank you to all of the councils that made this rare achievement for our State (only the 4th time achieved in the last 22 years).

Unfortunately—this past year we had 100 councils in our State that did not bring in a new member—about a third of our councils!

OUR PRIMARY GOAL THIS YEAR AS A STATE IS TO GROW OUR MEMBERSHIP FOR THE FIRST TIME IN 23 YEARS!

If these 100 councils each brought in 2 members, this last year—we would've GROWN as a State last year—so it's very ACHIEVABLE FOR US TO REACH THIS GOAL!

In the first month we have slightly improved over the last 2 years. We are ranked in the top third of jurisdictions after the 1st month of the Fraternal Year—so we are on the RIGHT TRACK!

To help PROMOTE growth in this first quarter of the year—we have a FAST START INCENTIVE:

FAST START INCENTIVE:

- Councils who meet 50-99% of their Supreme quota by September 1st will receive 25% off of their October per-capita billing from the State.
- Councils who achieve 100% or greater of their membership quota by September 1st will receive 75% off their October per-capita billing from the State.

To help support your membership goals this year we have our team of Diocesan Membership Coordinators: Dale Vannes (Green Bay), Scott Frome (La Crosse), 'Doc' Casey (Madison), Les Kostera (Milwaukee) and Mark Rasmussen (Superior).

We will achieve our goal of 1,300 NEW MEMBERS IF WE CAN ACHIEVE THE FOLLOWING:

I hope that DD's will make their council members aware that all handouts and other documents are available on the State Website.

The DD Huddle and Diocesan Meetings have been set for the Superior Diocese. Before you know it these dates will be upon us. It is critical that councils submit their Directory forms as the new Directory will be going to the printer in August.

Beginning in August I will start to publish District SE Status for the councils. This will begin as soon as I get my first Star Tracker report. One of the items that was noted by councils is to hopefully get an early warning for individuals whose training is about to expire. Members need to realize that Supreme will send out authorization for refresher training as the date approaches. Councils need to remind their directors to be on the lookout for these. As the year progresses, I hope to get the All-Regions report to the DD's so that they can check the status of training of their council members. This will hopefully close the gap caused by missed emails from Supreme. Remember that you must have 3 different individuals serving in the roles of Program, Community and Family Director. The GK and Program Director need to complete training while the other two directors must complete training and complete a background check. This training is critical for the safety of our youth and to our success as an organization.

Some of our State Officers and Delegates will be headed to the Supreme Convention in Nashville in August.

If your council has not installed its officers yet, please do so ASAP. I suggest that you get together with other councils and make a night of it: Installation followed by a meal with wives and family. This is a great time to pull our councils together. Remember there is power in numbers; we can help each other achieve the goals we choose to accomplish.

The establishment of the Father McGivney Guild was certainly a milestone marking the path to our founder's canonization. It operates out of the Supreme Council office in New Haven CT. The guild serves as a clearinghouse for information regarding Father McGivney, promotes devotion to his memory, develops and distributes materials about his life and virtue, receives reports of favors received through Father McGivney's intercession, and receives news of possible miracles. Membership in the guild is open to anyone interested in Father McGivney and his cause, including members of the Knights of Columbus and their families. A guild newsletter is sent to members several times a year. All materials produced to promote information and devotion to Father McGivney are automatically distributed to members of the guild

and, once a month, a mass is offered at St. Mary's Church in New Haven.

Guild membership is now more than 178,000. The Roman process of investigation into Father McGivney's life and holiness is nearing completion, and the investigation into the reported miracle is progressing. Don't be fooled. The growth of the Guild is but one step along the way. There are over 1.8 million members of the Knights of Columbus. Why are so many so hesitant to join the Guild? We have over 35,000 members alone in Wisconsin but as of 4/1/2022 there are only 1,239 Guild member in our State. The Guild depends on us to further the message of Father McGivney. If you previously held a role with access to Officers Online, you do not need a new invitation code. Your access will automatically be reactivated once the appropriate form is submitted.

If you do not remember your log on credentials, click "Account Assistant" or "Password Reset" on the sign in page and follow the instructions. If additional assistance is required contact our Customer Service Department at 800-380-9995, option 2 and provide your membership number and role.

If you have men showing there, **CONTACT** them. **INVITE** them to your Council meetings and activities. While you are together, invite them to attend an in-person or online **DEGREE** ceremony. **After** <u>completing</u> the degree, **PROCESS** them into your council. This is as simple as entering the degree date (or council approval date for a prior member or transfer in) in the field and clicking the TRANSFER button. If the member does not wish to join your council, please REJECT him and select the appropriate reason. Then please contact me so I may take the appropriate action based on the reasoning.

NEW MEMBER PROCESS:


Follow the standard procedures for a new e-member as with all new members:

- Completed form 100, or assigned e-member status in Prospect tab of Officers Online (OO).
- Admission committee vetting.
- Council action (voting) see <u>Guidelines for Online Voting Motions</u> if holding virtual meetings
- Degree Member must take the degree **prior** to being transferred into a council.
- Process the new 3rd degree member into your council via Form 100 submission or, Online form 100 using the Candidate tab data entry and transfer, or e-member transfer using the Prospect tab.
 - <u>REMEMBER:</u> If you use either the Prospect tab or the Candidate tab to process your new members, do NOT submit a mailed paper or scanned pdf of the form 100. It just confuses the issue and might result in duplicate entries. Use only one of the available methods.




Nothing has changed with the first screen of the form



Once they click on the 'Proceed to Join' button they will be presented with the new screen



The previous window or tab can be closed because it will no longer be used. Leaving it open does not affect the flow. The potential member will receive the below email and by clicking on the 'clicking here' hyperlink, a new tab or browser session will be opened



The potential member will be brought back into the application flow to continue the process. 

In 2021, Knights donated \$4.6 million and 469,000 volunteer hours to support these centers and the women and children they serve through cash donations and community service activities such as baby and maternity item drives.

Through the ASAP initiative, councils can now contribute even more support. For every \$500 a council donates to a qualifying pregnancy resource center or maternity home (up to \$2,000), the Supreme Council will donate \$100 more.

FAITH IN ACTION-COMMUNITY

Brothers,

Last month, I commented on Coats for Kids, Habitat for Humanity, Helping Hands and Global Wheelchairs; continue in your efforts to assist with Habitat in your area and work to raise money for wheelchair purchase. Also work to develop or continue with a Helping Hands project in your community or parish as well. Coats for Kids is a great program that every Council should be striving to implement. Supreme has announced that they will again do a matching funds program with the State Councils. So, if you have great need in your area that the State could assist you with as far as Coats are concerned, develop a proposal (numbers needed), distribution plan, how it could help evangelization, membership,

development, especially among minorities; and get that to your State Officer in Charge or to me by mid-October! This will once again focus on distribution of the coats on or around Black Friday, November 25.

Punt, Pass & Kick and fall Soccer programs should be well under way in planning and implementation. Remember that PPK Diocesan (Regional) Contests will be held between October 1 and October 24; Soccer as well if participation numbers warrant. The State PPK and Soccer Contests are planned for Saturday, October 29 in Eau Claire at Regis High School. (We are working on a big, new site for these in 2023 if possible.) Travel cards can be obtained from DDs, Diocesan Program Coordinators, the State Office or me. PPK and Soccer information is on the State website. Soccer materials can be ordered from Supreme.

The Supreme Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest will be run October 1-November 30 this year. Council winners will be due to **me** by December 31. The theme is "Explain How Young Catholics Can Evangelize our Faith to Families and Friends Who Have Turned Away from Religion and Encourage Them to Return to the Church and Embrace the Sacraments." Contest information is on the State website and materials can be ordered from the Supreme website.

Due to conflicts with the Supreme Essay Contest and in our effort to separate the 2 to help generate more participation, it has been decided to move the Culture of Life Essay Contest from October to January-February. We will comment more on the specifics of the 2022-23 theme, contest timeline, etc. over the next 2-3 months.

The Supreme "Keep Christ in Christmas" and State, "True Meaning of Christmas" Poster Contests will continue together this year (November 15-December 23). But we are strongly encouraging Councils to enter both contests (have schools place State entry forms on the back of them). Then expand your program to allow more students to enter (age 5, Ages 10-14; have schools put the Supreme entry forms on the back of those). All Council winners will then be sent to me by January 15. Information for both contests will be on the State website. Materials for the Supreme contest can be ordered from the Supreme website. More on this over the next 2-3 months. The big thing here is that schools and Councils must remember that the entry forms need to be completely, accurately, and legibly filled out.

We will continue to seek for Councils to seek to expand their Free Throw Contests (and Knowledge Contest) participant numbers to and beyond pre-pandemic levels.

Be sure to check Ernie Reinhart's Program article for this month. His comments on Program Innovation are right on the mark! Also, his reminder about the Stae Environment Program is most imperative. You CANNOT effectively, safely, legally run community and youth programs of any type without being Child Safety compliant!

Finally, remember to turn in your Form 10784s on program-specific forms for (Soccer, Essay, Poster) contests when your programs are finalized to the Supreme and State websites. Helps us all immensely in tracking what Councils have done, what yet needs to be done for awards, planning for next year, etc. Thanks. Have a great August!

LIFESAVERS FOR LIFE

Many of you have been asking about the Lifesavers for Life Program. The Life Savers for Life program is used by Councils to raise funds to support local pro-life causes, Supreme Culture of Life Assessment, raise local awareness about the Knights of Columbus's dedication to the sanctity of life and to educate the public through media campaigns about post-abortion healing opportunities and adoption options.

For many years, we have coordinated this program as a State Program. For the upcoming Fraternal Year, we are simplifying the program by making it a Council program, rather than a State program. Participating Councils will procure the LifeSavers from a local vender such as Walgreens, CVS, Walmart, Costco, Sam's Club or Amazon. Council members then stand outside of church or places of business and distribute them while holding a donation canister in one hand and handing out Life Savers with the other, much like we do with the Tootsie Rolls. Councils can do any size package of Lifesavers that they feel is appropriate and cost effective.

The Council then reports results as a Life Program using form 10784, just like any other Faith in Action Program. Since the funds were raised for Culture of Life Programs, it will be up to each Council to ensure that the funds raised are donated to Culture of Life programs, including Supreme Culture of Life Assessments, State Culture of Life Fund, Ultrasound Projects, and Pregnancy Support Centers. There will be no separate State Form this year, nor do Councils need to send funds to the State Office, and then wait for a disbursement back from the State Council.

Thank you to Dave Grau for his many years of dedicated service running the Lifesavers for Life program at the State Level.

SILVER ROSE PROGRAM

The Silver Rose this year was presented to Wisconsin by the Iowa State Council on July 17th at 3:00 PM. The Transfer will occur Wisconsin Visitor Center located at 211 S Main Street Fraire du Chien Wisconsin 53821. After the transfer the Rose will proceed to St. John's Catholic Church 710 S Wacouta Ave, Prairie du Chien for the service. The Iowa state Deputy and other dignitaries from both Wisconsin and Iowa are expected to attend. Fourth degree honor Guard members in the new uniform are encouraged to attend help make this transfer a meaningful event. Wisconsin will have the Silver Rose till it is transferred to Illinois on August 13th at Beloit Wisconsin. While we will have the Rose for 25 days a total of 41 parishes are scheduled to have services with the Rose.

We normally have a good supply of Prayer Booklets in both English and Spanish that travel with the Silver Rose. However, announcement posters (#10219 or #10723) need to order and posted by Councils prior to receiving the Rose to help assure good attendance in their parish. In the past the supply of Our Lady of

Guadalupe Pledge Cards (#9754) and Our Lady of Guadalupe Prayer Cards (#4753E or #4753S) get rapidly depleted. It is advised that councils order these in advance.

Since 1960, the <u>Silver Rose program</u>, originally called Operation Rose, has gathered Knights and Columbian Squires from Mexico, the United States and Canada under the mantle of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. In the mid-1990s, it was adopted as a Supreme Council initiative, which grew to encompass multiple pilgrimage routes and reaffirm the Order's commitment to the sanctity of human life.

Knights no longer carry live flowers, but roses cast from silver. Eight silver roses, including one blessed by Pope Francis, now stand in the place of that single flower, and they are shepherded each year by members of the Knights along eight distinct routes that extend from Canada to Mexico. But the intent is the same: to reaffirm the Order's commitment to the sanctity of life and honor the Blessed Virgin under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas.
