As we enter the month of "All Saints" and "All Souls" I can't help but consider a modern day saint who was doing ministry for the Lord during at least some of our lifetimes. It is St. Padre Pio. For those who know little about him, he was a Capuchin Monk who lived his life in Italy. He was the first priest ever in the Church to have the stigmata (the five wounds of Jesus) for 50 years, during which he suffered greatly from their continual bleeding. He considered it a privilege to suffer with the Lord for the sake of others. He was known to have the gift of bi-location, and was greatly sought after as a confessor by those who needed God's mercy, hope, and peace through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Most of all, St. Padre Pio was known (and continues to be known) and loved as a great intercessor before the throne of God. Many requests for his intercession have brought countless blessings and even miracles for some who were the subject of his intercession.

I hope and pray that we all remember to ask the saints like Padre Pio for help and support as we seek to walk the way of Christ and follow his teachings. The saints were wonderful men and women of faith who can be great role models for us as we participate in this "Year of Faith".

Retention is a key to success for membership. When you drop a member you then have to recruit a new member to make your goal so it is important to have good retention committee. I know that you can't save everyone but find out there objections and try to resolve their issue.

Council Officers should be leading by example and have recruited/our recruiting one new member. The Persons with Intellectual Disabilities Drive is an excellent tool for your Council to gain visibility and at the same times lets your Parrish see the good work that you do. Let everyone in church know that you are a Knight by wearing your Knight's shirt your name tag to church. Visibility increases interest.

OWNERSHIP: When you recruit a new member it is important that you take ownership of him. Be a mentor; take him to the 2nd and 3rd Degree's. Get him involved in activities. Everyone can't do everything but we can do some. Involvement of members keeps the Council growing.

Here are some ideas for the coming months that might help your recruiting:

Continuous: Officers Challenge - Recruit one new member

November: Charity Challenge – Invite potential members to help with your charitable activities. Christ the King Corporate Communion 24th and 25th November is an event that bring together council and/or parish families to celebrate the Eucharist and share time and a meal together. Let's make this happen because this is an Order wide event.

December: Keep Christ in Christmas. Recruit a new Knight before Christmas. Invite prospects to your Christmas celebrations. You should be at a minimum of 50% of your yearly recruiting goal. Start planning for the 2nd half of the year.

January: Review the last 6 months and fine tune the remaining year for recruitment. Young Adult Challenge; invite potential young adults to an event so that they can see the work the council accomplishes. Promote Venerable Michael J McGivney Membership Campaign.


LIFE CHAIN Francisco Olguin State Advocate

PENNIES FROM HEAVEN Ozro N Barclay, Chairman, Pennies From Heaven

The purpose of the fund for Pennies From Heaven is for the Councils, once they have been notified of an individual or family who are suffering from a sudden unexpected loss due to many causes such as an accident, fire, tornado, illness, loss of employment, etc., to request a grant of up to \$300 for the individual or father / mother to help them find shelter, food, clothing, pay due bills, or other necessities of life,

A system has been in place for a number of years that permits us to respond within the day that the request is received or at the latest within a day or two at the latest. The way it has been working is for the Grand Knight or his representative to e-mail the Pennies From Heaven chairman with as much complete details as possible. These details will include names of the individual or family, the cause for the request, such as length of unemployment, total loss of home due to fire or storm, member of the family suffered a severe accident or illness that placed him or the family in a financial burden, etc. Also include the name and address of the grand knight to whom the check is to be sent for presentation to the individual or family.

Once the chairman of the Pennies From Heaven receives the e-mail, he will review it and if any needed information is not included, he will call the sender by phone and discuss the request. Once he is able to make a determination of any amount to be granted, he will forward the e-mail to the State Deputy for his approval. If this approval is not received within a reasonable amount of time, a phone call is made to him for his verbal approval of the request. A letter of approval is then typed and e-mailed to the State Secretary with copies to the State Treasurer, the State Deputy and the Grand Knight of the council. This letter informs that a voucher is to be sent to the State Treasurer for him to write a check in the approved amount and that the check is to be mailed to the Grand Knight for presentation. If it is determined that a special rush is needed, the letter will also request it.

Recently it was determined that instead of using our approved system as above, some have been using a typed letter which then adds three or four days delay in the receipt of the request. Sometimes delays are unavoidable, but it is my desire to react to your request as fast as possible so that the party needing the money gets it in hand as soon as he or the family needs it.


