

A 'Fast Start' which is defined as bringing in 20% plus of our new members in the first 3 months of the Fraternal Year, has consistently been a challenge for Wisconsin. We must break this pattern.

Councils that take the 'Summer off' from Meetings, need to realize that Membership growth is a 365day-a-year task—there is never a day off from 'inviting' a new member to join our great order!

If each of our Councils in our State took the **PERSONAL INITIATIVE** to bring in at



least one new member between now and September 30th, not only will our State Council get off to the much-needed FAST START but your council will be well on its way towards achieving their membership goals as well!

This Fraternal Year marks another new beginning, another FRESH START.

I am excited to serve State Deputy Pat Reiff as our State Membership Director, and our team of Diocesan Directors, Diocesan Membership Coordinators, and your District Deputies and Field Agents are here to serve you. Please let us know how we can help you achieve your goals and we look forward to working with each of you, once again, this upcoming Fraternal Year!

BROTHERS, THANK YOU for the opportunity to serve as your State Deputy for the last two years, and as a State Officers for the last six years. It seems like it was just a few weeks ago that I was elected State Deputy. Time just few by. Tempus Fugit. While we accomplished a great deal over the past two years, there is still much work to be done. Some accomplishments include:

- ▷ Over 1900 new members joined the order in Wisconsin.
- ▶ Councils significantly increased both Donations and Volunteer hours – We are helping more
- ▶ We introduced Diocesan Directors to provide additional support for Council Leaders – we currently have 3 Diocese filled. We still need to fill Superior and Green Bay.
- ▶ We launched the YouCat Bible Sacramental Gifts Program, distributing approximately 3000 bibles to confirmation students in just the first 2 years of the program.
- ▶ We leveraged a Supreme matching program to significantly increase the number of Coats for Kids being distributed in Wisconsin, with over 7000 coats distributed last fall.
- ▶ We added 5 new Councils in Wisconsin.
- ▶ We introduced Cor in Wisconsin.
- ▶ We trained 35 New District Deputies
- ▶ We redistricted the Madison Diocese in support of the Into the Deep initiative that realigned parishes and the majority of the clergy in the Diocese.
- ▶ We were recognized in the Supreme Knights Circle of Honor for the 2022-2023 Fraternal Year.
- ▶ Wisconsin continues to be in the Top 5 Jurisdictions in both grants and dollars in the ASAP (Aid and Support After Pregnancy)
- ▶ Wisconsin continues to be in the Top 5 Jurisdictions in support for Seminarians through the RSVP program.
- ▶ Bishops and Diocesan Offices asking for help with various projects, not just donations.

While we accomplished much over the past two years, we still have a number of areas that are in need of improvement as we move forward.

▶ We need to find ways to **Improve Communications** to the Membership - We use Flocknote to communicate with DD's, GK's, and FS's, but do not have a mechanism to communicate with the other 32K members in the



- We need to improve maintenance of our Website. Too often information is missing or out of date.
- We need Leadership Stability and Grown at the Council, District, Diocesan and State Levels. We need to build a bench so that brothers are not filling two or more roles. Having a bench is especially crucial when you consider that ten State Officers over the past ten years chose to not run for another term. It is also worth noting that we replace about 25% of our DD's annually, with an additional 20% of Districts that go without a DD.
- ▶ With more and more parishes supporting Hispanic Ministry, we must find ways to better support our Hispanic Councils, as well as developing new ones. We truly need a team in each Diocese that can support this effort. Over time, we need to elect a few bilingual brothers to our State Officer team.
- As we see more and more need in our Communities, we need more Councils to focus their Community Programs on helping people in need through Coats for Kids, Helping Hands, Beds for Kids, Food Packing events, and Disaster Response.

As we continue to focus on being First in Faith, First in Charity, I know that we will find ways to adapt our programs to continue to help more people.

As Immediate Past State Deputy, I look forward to working with our new team of State Officers, State Deputy Pat Reiff, State Chaplain Fr Brian Dulli, State Secretary Ross Larson, State Treasurer Ernie Reinhart, State Advocate Dr. Dave Kreutz, and State Warden James Vosters, as we continue to work to grow the order in Wisconsin.

BROTHER KNIGHTS, PRAISE be to Jesus! These are the words that fill my heart as our Order continues to "refocus" our mission back to its roots, which is to evangelize Catholic men and help them grow closer to Jesus Christ and his Church. This mission to evangelize is also basic to our calling as baptized Catholics.

The Order has always evangelized (and will continue to evangelize) through the charitable works that we do as part of our **Faith-In-Action** programs. But not only are we called to show God's love by our charitable actions as Knights, we are also called to help others to grow into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ who is the sole reason for all the charitable works that we do. In other words, we must be ready, as Knights, to help make **disciples** of Jesus Christ. In the words of our Supreme Knight, Patrick Kelly, "Knights must be **first in faith** as they are **first in charity**."

The purpose of the Cor initiative is to help make disciples of Catholic men in our councils, parishes, and surrounding community. Therefore, every council should prayerfully consider if they can participate in the Cor initiative in some way.

At our recent State Convention, I was able to present some results of a survey that was conducted just before the convention. We had a great participation rate with 40% of all the councils in the state having at least one person respond to the survey! This is an outstanding

participation rate for any survey! Thank you! A survey like this just doesn't happen on its own. Therefore, I would like to offer a special thanks to Brother Justin Knapp, Diocesan Director, EFF-Madison for his significant contributions in developing the survey and to help lead the Cor initiative in the Madison diocese.

One of the highlights of the survey was determining that there are (18) councils currently conducting Cor and (16) others who are planning to implement Cor. This is a very good start for Cor in Wisconsin. Unfortunately, the survey also indicated that 41% of respondents knew little or nothing at all about Cor. Clearly, this is an area for improvement!

In future KC State Newsletters, I hope to provide information, recommendations and insights that may be helpful in implementing Cor in those councils that feel called to do so. I also hope to share testimonials from various councils who are conducting Cor. As always, detailed information on Cor can be found here.

FINANCIAL SECRETARIES, **GRAND** Knights, District Deputies, Brother Knights all, as you review my State Newsletter article, please keep the following points in mind:

- ▶ Supreme's Fraternal Year End E-member Target Goal for Wisconsin is 423 new Emembers.
- ▶ As of June 27th, we have received a total of **430 online** appliations or 101.7% of our quota.

My thanks to all of you that have taken advantage of the online application process.

It's a quick & efficient means of bringing in new members on a timely basis. New members get posted to your roster in days vs weeks when using the old form 100 and sending to Supreme.

We need more councils to avail themselves of this system.

This is my last article as State Online Membership Chairman, as I will be assuming the position as your new State Deputy on July 1st. 2024.

Our new Immediate Past State Deputy John Huttenhoff will be taking over this position.

Although we exceeded our application goal, we only converted to council rosters 306 or 71% of those 430 men.


Of the 124 remaining applicants, 55 chose not to transfer at this time and we will follow up with them as we move forward. But that still leaves 69 applicants that are still pending joining councils. I urge the WGK's WFS's and WDD's to expedite the process of reaching out to these men on a timely basis. If there are issues let us know.

As you are doing your programs & church drives, be sure to include the E-membership online invitation app. in your invitation process to potential members.

Bottom line: 430 new members have already utilized the online process. IT WORKS!

WGK & WFS please frequently review your council's PROSPECT tab and if you are having difficulty in

making contact, or any other issue, let us know we will gladly assist you with reaching a remedy.









Officers Online Access

Members in a role permitted access to Officers Online will be emailed an invitation code once the Supreme Council receives the appropriate form from the state council, local council, or assembly indicating the election or appointment, and records this information. If you do not receive an invitation code within a reasonable time, click "Account Assistant" on the sign in page and follow the instructions.

If you previously held a role with access to Officers Online, you do not need a new invitation code. Your access will automatically be reactivated once the appropriate form is submitted.

If you do not remember your log on credentials, click "Account Assistant" or "Password Reset" on the sign in page and follow the instructions. If additional assistance is required contact our Customer Service Department at 800-380-9995, option 2 and provide your membership number and role.

Are you a member?

The Blessed Michael J. McGivney Guild serves as a source for information about the life, works and spirituality of Father McGivney. The Guild distributes informational materials about him, receives reports of favors granted through his intercession and oversees the distribution of relics. BROTHERS, AS WE begin the 2024-25 Fraternal Year, we would like to see all Councils get off to a fast start in July and August with their Faith in Action and Youth programming. It's easy to do so and get a jump start on the Community portion of your next SP-7 in the process. Here's how you do that:

- 1) Plan now for where, when you'll be doing your Coats for Kids Drive and make arrangements with that church, school, shelter, organization, etc. accordingly. Get your funding in order. Determine where you'll get your coats from, about how many you'll need including signs. Do likewise for any other items you may be handing out as well (scarves, mittens/gloves, hats, snowpants, boots, etc.). Hold needed fundraisers for the capital you'll need to do this.
- 2) Likewise, summer's a great time to do a brat fry, pancake breakfast, bowl-a-thon or golf outing, ice cream social, etc. to raise money for Global Wheelchairs, a Habitat for Humanity project or a local Council in need of money as a result of recent storms or floods.

It's only \$150 per wheelchair so a lot can be done there. Get the brothers together to work a day or a week at a nearby Habitat project or their Re-Store facility. Contact your State Disaster Prep Chair Paul

Shepherd, the grand Knight of Councils where recent disasters took place or State Office to see where your donations are needed. You can also check to see that plans and supplies for disaster preparations and reaction in your parish or community are in order.

- 3) Check with your pastor or parish leadership team if you haven't already done so at your annual or semi-annual Evaluation and Planning Meeting with them, to see what projects around the parish, school need doing that you can lead or assist with. Likewise, do so with your community leadership or other civic organizations. This can go along way toward fulfilling your Helping Hands program needs.
- 4) During these summer months, it's not at all too early to run your Punt, Pass, Kick and/or Soccer Challenge contests rather than waiting until September. Diocesan Contests will again be held in mid-October and the State Finals, while still TBA, will likely be held in De Pere on either Nov. 2 or 9.
