"Since AD2000, 14 million Catholics have left the faith, parish religious education of children has dropped by 24%, Catholic school attendance has dropped by 19%, infant baptism has dropped by 28%, adult baptism has dropped by 31%, and sacramental Catholic marriages have dropped by 41%. This is a serious breach, a gaping hole in Christ's battle lines."



State Program Director - From the Desk of the Professor

Brother Knights,

As we begin our 2016-17 Fraternal/Program Year, we have both a continuing and new focus to keep in mind. For continuing focus, we would like to congratulate all those Councils who earned Star Council status and/or the State Complete Council Award. Those continue to be the goals that every Council should strive to achieve! We will also continue to focus on all the great programs that our Councils have operated and engaged in past years whether local programs in your parish or community; or State/Supreme programs (eg. PPK, Soccer, Coats for kids, RSVP, Food for Families, Culture of Life Essay Contest, Family of the Month, Ultrasound projects, etc.) to name only a few. You should be using your fraternal planners and already working with your officers, directors and members to be organizing these activities for this year. July and August Church Drives, Corporate Communions and 5th Sunday Rosaries, Family Week programs in August, etc. should be already in the planning stages! Hopefully, your 185s (Officers), 365s (Directors and Service Personnel), Summer Audit forms are already in or will be very soon! 1^{st} (Admission) Degrees should be on the books ready to lead new members on to their 2nd (Formation) and 3rd (Knighthood) Degrees ASAP.

Turning to new focus, I was amazed at my experience in June in Dallas at the Supreme Programming Meeting how emphasis has changed. While there was still considerable emphasis on membership recruitment and retention (so very important to our Wisconsin jurisdiction and our Honored Order as a whole), there was actually very little emphasis placed on the above mentioned "signature" programs. Instead, Supreme is turning its attention to the initiatives it began 2 years ago on **Building the Domestic Church** and to the Supreme Knight's new initiatives which he announced late last year; namely that we are to:



Be the strong right arm of the pastor.
Meet regularly with him to find out what he wants.

3) Be strongly involved in <u>all</u> parish programs, groups, etc.

4) Support the activities of the parish,

not work in conflict with them or impose our programs on top of them.

5) Offer our programs as supplements to or extensions of parish programs into the community (charity, evangelization).

6) Seek to involve as many parish/community members, parents as possible in our programs.

7) Involve <u>all our Council</u> in the Building the Domestic Church initiative by implementing the following programs and engaging as many parish families as possible:

- a) Father's Day affirmation of wedding vows
- b) Feast of the Holy Family consecration of families
- c) Holy Family prayer (icon) program
- d) Journey or the Inn Advent (Posada) program
- e) Family Fully Alive program (small brown booklet's)
- f) Into the Breach booklet men's study program
- g) 5th Sunday Rosary and Corporate Communion program

8) Involve our GAs and FAs in working toward Fr. McGivney's goals of <u>a Council in every parish</u>, every member <u>an insurance member</u>! This would hopefully result in a FA attached to every Council.

I will be expanding on these goals and programs in the months ahead. (The entire outline of my recent presentation at the summer DD meeting in Stevens Point is on the State website.) But, let me remind you that it was stressed to us in Dallas by the Supreme Knight and leadership that these new initiatives/ programs are: here to stay, not an option, required of all Councils, not going away!! So, let's all strive to immerse ourselves in these programs with our Councils, parishes, communities and make them work toward the Evangelization, Faith Formation, Stronger Families and Charitable Outreach that Pope Francis and Our Worthy Supreme Knight Carl Anderson have called us to lead.

SETTING NEW RECORDS ! Helping Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ID)

The 2016 Helping Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities drive set all new records. The total collected was \$714,318.67 which surpasses the previous record set in 2015 by \$34,360. Green Bay and Superior raised their record highs by \$5,000, Milwaukee by \$9,400 and La Crosse by \$16,000. More councils participated in the drive in 2016 than they did in 2015.

Some councils raised their own personal numbers.

- \Rightarrow Birchwood, 9546, is the only council in the State to double their 2015 number
- \Rightarrow Pewaukee 3562, increased their collection over \$3,000, Schofield 4628 by over \$2,000

Knights of Columbus Safe Environment Program

Tomorrow's future rests with today's youth! As part of Supreme's initiative of Building the Domestic Church while strengthening our Parish, the Knights of Columbus has taken the initiative to emphasize the importance of our Youth Programs and those involved in the leadership of our youth.

The Board of Directors of the Knights of Columbus has decided that all members in youth serving roles and certain officer positions be required to take online youth protection and safe environment training. Specifically, State Deputies, State Squire Chairman, State Youth Directors, Grand Knights, Youth Directors, Columbian Squires Chairmen, Chief Counselors, Committee Counselors, and Faithful Navigators (if their assembly sponsors a Circle) are required to complete Praesidium's Armatus online training. District Deputies are encouraged to take this training also.

Youth leaders and members in designated leadership positions requiring Praesidium's Armatus online youth protection training will receive a username and password via e-mail or regular mail with specific instructions for compliance and must complete the KC training within 30 days of receiving notification or otherwise they will not be allowed by Supreme to be a Youth Leader. The website is: <u>http://website.praesidiuminic.com/login</u>. In addition these individuals will also need to comply with their Parish and/or Diocesan Safe Environment Youth Program(s). For all others, the same website is used in this manner. On the Armatus login page, enter your credentials [User name: memberID+lastname (1235468jones) the Password: kofcsafe]. You will be asked to change your password later.


The Supreme online training must be completed every two years. Additional information about the Knights of Columbus Safe Environment Program is available on the Supreme website: (http://www.kofc.org/un/en/members/ programs/youth-activities/safe-environmentprogram.html).

It is the policy of the Knights of Columbus that all members selected to serve as youth leaders fulfill all local diocesan safe environment/youth protection training and background check requirements before they begin their service or within 30 days thereafter.

Only members who have had the required diocesan training and passed the required diocesan background check are authorized to serve young people through Knights of Columbus programs and activities.

Make no mistake about it. All the hours of work and money raised by KC men is pro-life work in action. However, I think each of you must also know that pro-life Christians are in a war with powers that deny the value of life in the womb that is not wanted or life of the terminally ill and aged that is considered not useful. There is no guarantee that pro-life forces will win this war in our life time. Below are a few of the headlines from the battlefield that I found on this week's blog from "LifeNews.com".

- Supreme Court nullified a Texas law which would have required abortion clinics to have licensed doctors with admitting privileges at a local hospital. This week another Planned Parenthood Abortion Clinic sends Its 60th botched abortion victim to the ER.
- The presumptive Republican presidential candidate is vetting a pro-life Senator for VP
- ◊ The presumptive Democratic presidential candidate is considering keeping the proabortion attorney general on in the next administration.

- Planned Parenthood Thanked Senate Democrats for Putting Abortion Ahead of Zika Virus Funding.
- 1,379 Babies Saved from Abortion in Iowa Over the Last Four Years.
- Catholic Nursing Home Sued for Refusing to Kill Patients in Euthanasia.
- Quebec Orders Palliative Care Doctors to Kill Patients in Euthanasia

This is the 56th year of the program which began in 1960 as a project of the Columbian Squires of North America to honor the Blessed Virgin under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. The First Rose was a natural rose. The program has continued as a project of Columbian Squires circles, councils and Fourth Degree assemblies working in unison to promote devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe. In the 1990s Supreme Knight decided to make the Silver Rose a Supreme Council program.

The first effort consisted of one route carrying a Silver Rose from London, Ontario through the central U.S. to Texas for transfer to Mexico. Soon there were three Silver Rose routes, one mimicking the original route; another starting in Manitoba and moving to British Columbia, then down to the Pacific Coast before turning east into Arizona and on to Texas; and a third route starting in New York, then down the eastern seaboard, then to several southern states to Texas.

In 2001 the Supreme Knight expanded the program by establishing the "Running of the Rose" from the 119th Annual Meeting of the Supreme Council in Toronto. The "Running of the Rose" honors not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and the unity of the Order, but reaffirms the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of "One Life, One Rose," it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses."

This year there are six Silver Rose routes. Routes 1 thru 5 started on 6 March. Route 6 starts on 10 April. They all end on 12 December, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Not all of the Roses go to the Basilica in Monterrey, Mexico.

This is the third year that the Wisconsin Knights are part of the program. We are

Because the family is the subject of the New Evangelization, we want to share our faith with other families.

The new evangelization depends largely on the domestic church. In our time, as in times past, the eclipse of God, the spread of ideologies contrary to the family and the degradation of sexual ethics are connected. And just as the eclipse of God and the crisis of the family are linked, so the New Evangelization is inseparable from the Christian family. The family is indeed the way of the Church because it is the "human space" of our encounter with Christ. Spouses "not only receive the love of Christ and become a saved community, but they are also called upon to communicate Christ's love to their brethren, thus becoming a saving community." The family founded on the sacrament of marriage is a particular realization of the Church, saved and saving, evangelized and evangelizing community. Just like the Church, it is called to welcome, radiate and show the world the love and presence of Christ. The reception and transmission of divine love are realized in the mutual commitment of the spouses, in generous and responsible procreation, in the care and education of children, work and social relationships, with attention to the needy, in participation in church activities, in commitment to civil society. The Christian Family to the extent it succeeds in living love as communion and service as a reciprocal gift open to all, as a journey of permanent conversion supported by the grace of God, reflects the splendor of Christ in the world and the beauty of the divine Trinity.






