

Field Agent's Message

Are you aware of new changes for 2020? The IRS has announced:

- ❖ IRA contributions are limited to \$6000 for 2020 returns (\$7000 for ages 50+).
- ❖ You can contribute to your IRA beyond age 70 ½ as long as you are working.
- ❖ The required beginning date for required minimum distributions (RMD) has been changed from age 70 ½ to 72 (those who turned 70 ½ in 2019 or earlier remain subject to RMDs).
- ❖ Did you miss the July 15th filing deadline? Individual tax filers can use Free File on the IRS website to electronically request an automatic tax-filing extension to Oct. 15th, 2020. To get the extension, you must estimate your tax liability on the extension form and should pay any amount due.
- ❖ RMDs require most non-spouse beneficiaries to withdraw inherited account balances within 10 years of the owner's death.



Chaplain's Message

August is a month with four Sundays in Ordinary time. Among all the big Feast Days, two stand out: **The Assumption** and **The Queenship of Mother Mary**. Focusing on the Gospel passages of the four Sundays, we find an interesting theme.

On **August 8-9**, we read Matthew:14:22-33. Jesus has just fed a multitude of people with five loaves and two fish. He now tests the faith of the Apostles. While they are in a boat being tossed by strong winds, they see Jesus Walk on the Water. Peter invites himself to approach Jesus. Jesus says; — Come. When Peter experiences the strong wind, he loses faith and sinks. All the Apostles are afraid. But Jesus joins the and his presence calms the winds and strengthens their courage.

On **August 15-16**, we read Matthew 15:21-28. Here, Jesus uses the example of a simple woman who is pleading for help. Her faith moves Jesus to say; — O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish.

For **August 22-23**, we read Matthew 16:13-20. Jesus had proved himself through his teaching and miracles. He now asks his disciples: —Who do people say that the Son of Man is? Peter is bold. Inspired by the Divine he replies; — You are the Christ, the Son of the living God It is here that Peter and his successors are given the authority to govern this Institution that Jesus establishes —The Catholic Church.

And finally, on **August 29-30**, we hear Matthew 16:21-27 where Jesus makes it very clear — whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. Faith is a pure gift from God to each of us. We who are baptized Christian Catholics, have the Scriptures, the teachings of the Church and the Sacraments to help us mature our Faith.

Let us make every effort use every opportunity to do so. Let us abandon our own selfish desires for the love and service of our God All that God asks of us is this: **TO BELIEVE and TO BE FAITHFUL**. Reminding ourselves that God is always present to us, let me ask myself: **Who is Jesus Christ TO ME? Who do I want Him to be FOR ME? What does Jesus want FROM ME?**


